



Most homes have at least one ceiling fan, and some have one in almost every room. Ceiling fans help the indoors feel more comfortable. While they are a decorative addition to any home, they can also help lower your monthly energy costs if used properly. Check out these four (4) simple and easy tips for making the most of your ceiling fans

**1. FLIP THE SWITCH** – Most ceiling fans have a switch near the blades. In warm months, make sure the blades operate in a manner that pushes air down, which creates "wind chill" and makes the room feel cooler than it actually is.

- 2. ADJUST YOUR THERMOSTAT In the summer, when using a ceiling fan in conjunction with your AC system, you can turn your thermostat up a few degrees without any reduction in comfort. This saves money since a fan is generally less costly to operate than an AC unit.
- 3. CHOOSE THE RIGHT SIZE Make sure your ceiling fan is the right size for the room. A fan with blades that are 36-44 inches in diameter are best for rooms up to 225 square feet.
- **4. TURN IT OFF** Fans are intended to cool people not the room. So treat them just like you do a light... when the room is unoccupied, turn the ceiling fan off. Also, never leave ceiling fans running in outside areas unless people are nearby to feel the breeze.

Some marketers will impose a fee to disconnect and/or reconnect service on top of Atlanta Gas Light's charge, but True Natural Gas does not.



#### Oven Baked Chicken Parmesan

1 lb. boneless chicken breasts 1 eaa

½ cup Italian breadcrumbs

¼ cup parmesan cheese
1 jar pasta sauce

1 cup mozzarella cheese,

shredded

#### Instructions:

Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Lightly beat egg in a bowl. In a separate bowl, mix breadcrumbs and parmesan cheese. Dip chicken in egg and then coat each side in the breadcrumb mixture. Coat a 13x9 inch pan with cooking spray and place chicken in it. Bake uncovered for 20 minutes. Pour sauce over chicken and top with mozzarella cheese. Bake an additional 10 minutes.
