The temperatures are getting warmer, and as such, electric bills tend to go up as air conditioners operate longer hours. Since air conditioners account for approximately 45% of a typical electric bill, start using these low-cost ways to keep your energy usage as low as possible this summer.

- ADJUST THE THERMOSTAT. If your family is heading out for the day, set your thermostat three to five degrees higher than usual. Remember, experts recommend an air conditioner setting of 78 degrees when the home is occupied.
- 2. BIGGER IS NOT ALWAYS BETTER. An air conditioner functions by removing heat and humidity from the air. While an oversized unit can cool rooms quickly, it can only remove a portion of the humidity, leaving the room with a damp and clammy feeling. Be sure to consult your HVAC professional about correctly sizing your HVAC system.
- **3. SOFTEN OR BLOCK THOSE RAYS.** Close curtains and lower blinds on the sunny side of your home. To avoid blocking the view, consider adding an outdoor awning or applying reflective window film.
- **4. MAKE SURE "OFF" IS REALLY "OFF".** Each of the appliances and electronic devices you have around your home use energy and generate heat as long as they are attached to a power source. Plug nearby gadgets into a single power strip that can be turned "off" with one switch.
- **5. FEEL THE BREEZE.** When you are home, use ceiling fans to create a "wind chill" effect. Combining fans with air conditioning allows you to set your thermostat higher, while still feeling cool.

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Sealing the Deal on Home Energy Efficiency



As a child, you probably heard the phrase, "close the door – are you trying to cool the whole neighborhood?" Well, the person that gave you that advice had a great point. It takes a lot of energy to condition the air in your home. So, when it "goes straight out the door," the energy you paid for that cooling goes right along with it. The same concept applies to the more subtle air leaks you may have around your home. By weather-stripping your doors, operable windows, and other openings in outdoor walls, floors, and ceilings... you can keep your conditioned air inside, where it belongs.

Since the material needed to seal air leaks is rather inexpensive, it is one of the most cost-effective steps you can take to increase your home's energy efficiency. Proper weather-stripping not only prevents your conditioned air from getting out, it can also reduce noise, pollen, dust and insects from coming into your home. Installation is quick and easy, even if you're not an expert do-it-yourselfer.

To determine how much you need, simply add up the perimeters of all the windows and doors to be treated. Then, add about 10% to cover any unintended waste. Be sure to check the packaging, so you get strips of the appropriate depths and widths, as well as a product able to withstand the elements, friction and other types of wear and tear associated with each location.
