HVAC System

Summer is officially here. It's time for cookouts, swimming pools, camping and enjoying the great outdoors with family and friends. When it's time to come back indoors, there's nothing better than that cool blast you feel from your home's air conditioning unit.

Your HVAC system is essential to keeping your home comfortable all year long; and if it breaks down, it's also one of the more costly pieces of equipment to repair and/or replace. Luckily, there are simple steps you can take now to lengthen the life of your HVAC system.

Change or clean filters. Dirty filters
 block airflow, which can greatly decrease the efficiency of your system. The
 Department of Energy recommends changing or cleaning filters
 every month or two.

• Consider a tune up.

A thorough tune up from a licensed HVAC professional will ensure your AC is in tip top condition.



• Clear space around the HVAC unit.

Falling leaves and grass left behind from the lawnmower can create buildup around your unit. If you have foliage near the unit, trim it back at least 2 ft. around the condenser to increase airflow.

When HVAC equipment fails, it's inconvenient and uncomfortable — especially during the dog days of summer. Remember, your HVAC system runs best when it's regularly cleaned and serviced. With a little

maintenance along the

way, you can add years to your system's lifespan.
