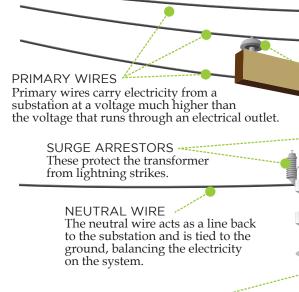

SECONDARY SERVICE DROP Carries electricity at a reduced voltage to a Sawnee EMC electric meter.

GROUND WIRE

The ground wire connects to the neutral wire to complete the circuit inside the transformer. It also directs electricity from lightning safely into the earth.

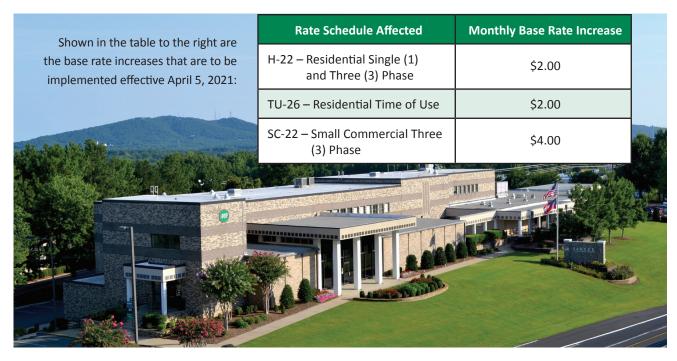

BASE RATE CHANGE Reminder

In late 2019, Sawnee EMC's Board of Directors approved a change to the base rate of certain residential and commercial rate schedules initially planned to take effect in April 2020. As our area began to experience the challenges of COVID-19, the Board of Directors proactively addressed the situation and quickly agreed to postpone the base rate increase until April 5, 2021.

Since the effective date is nearing, the staff of Sawnee wanted to remind you of these changes that will soon take place.

Sawnee's base rate is a billing component that partially recovers the fixed costs incurred by the co-op to serve each of Sawnee's member-owners, regardless of their actual electricity usage. A base rate is utilized by electric utilities nationwide to help maintain the distribution system that delivers electricity to all electric meters, as well as the ongoing installation of operating and maintenance of poles, wire, transformers, and other items required to provide reliable electric service.



Sawnee EMC's staff works every day to provide exceptional electric service, and as your local, not-for-profit electric cooperative, our primary goal is to minimize the effects of cost increases, while maintaining reliable electric service that members can count on. Even with these upcoming base rate changes, Sawnee still remains among the lowest of all of Georgia's electric providers.

Beef Tips over Rice

Ingredients:

1.5 lbs. stew beef

1 lb. sliced portabella mushrooms

1 large onion, diced

1/2 bell pepper, diced

1 stalk of celery, diced

1 leek, diced

1 can Cream of Mushroom soup

1 can Cream of Onion soup

1 can Cream of Celery soup

2 Tbsp. Worcestershire sauce

2 Tbsp. sour cream

2 cups water



In a large skillet, on medium heat, sear meat on both sides, but do not cook throughout. Place meat and all other ingredients in slow cooker. Cook on low for 5-6 hours or high 3-4 hours. Serve over rice or egg noodles.
