## Sawnee in the Top in National Survey Among Utilities

For 2023, Sawnee EMC has received an American Customer Satisfaction Index (ACSI) score of 93 out of a maximum score of 100 for our sector. The ACSI score is an economic indicator that measures the satisfaction of a consumer. This was one of the highest scores in the nation. By comparison, the average electric cooperative scored a 74, as per the ACSI Utility Sector Report. As a member-owned electric cooperative, Sawnee EMC operates such that its decisions are meant solely to benefit its members; and the cooperative business model allows the staff to make member satisfaction one of their top priorities.

# 7 Questions to Consider BEFORE Installing Rooftop Solar



The benefits of installing rooftop solar panels may seem like a no-brainer, but the reality is, not every home (and homeowner's situation) is the same.

There are several factors to consider before pulling the trigger on a rooftop solar system. These include determining if your home will receive enough sun to achieve your goals, finding the right contractor, negotiating contracts and other details.

Investing in solar for your home is a major decision and needs to be approached with a lot of thought and consideration. If you're considering rooftop solar, Sawnee EMC can help.

Here are seven (7) questions to consider before installing rooftop solar panels.

- 1 What are my goals?** If your primary goal is to save money on electric bills, you may be able to achieve this through a Sawnee EMC free energy audit, which can identify areas of the home for maximum energy savings. If your main goal is to use renewable energy, consider signing up for Sawnee EMC's Virtual Solar Program. You can receive a portion of the sun, without having to invest and maintain a home solar system.
- 2 Is my roof suitable for solar?** Your roof should be in good condition before installing solar. If your roof is old or in poor shape, it may need to be replaced before panels can be installed. Additionally, your roof should receive a lot of sun to make the most of a rooftop system. Consider how much sun (and shade) the roof receives and if any trees will need to be trimmed or removed. Solar panels perform best when facing south, so keep this in mind as you think about where the panels will be mounted.
- 3 How long will I own the home?** If you're considering rooftop solar, you're likely planning to stay in the home for several years. But if you plan to sell the home at some point down the road, consider that not all potential buyers will want to maintain a rooftop solar system. If you are considering a contract to lease the solar system, carefully review the terms and what those mean to you now and in the future.
- 4 Can the contractor provide up-to-date documentation?** But be sure to request proof and documentation of the contractor's licensing, permitting and other credentials. Comb through company reviews, check the contractor's status with Better Business Bureau, etc.—do your homework on the front end before signing a contract.
- 5 Does the contract seem reasonable and fair?** If you decide to hire a contractor to install rooftop solar, carefully read the fine print of the contract. Do the system performance calculations seem realistic? Does the project timeframe sound reasonable? Negotiate the contract terms to fit your goals and your financial situation.
- 6 Who will maintain the solar system?** Determining who is responsible for maintaining the solar system will depend on who owns the system. If you lease the system from a solar installer, it may be their responsibility. Periodically, solar panels need to

be cleaned as dirt and debris can impact panel performance. Parts may also need to be replaced, so it's important to know who will take on these responsibilities.

#### 7 How will I work with Sawnee EMC?

Finally, but equally important, you should contact Sawnee EMC if you decide to install solar. If the system is to be interconnected to the electric grid, you'll need to sign a Sawnee EMC interconnection agreement. Find this and more online at [sawnee.com/solar](https://sawnee.com/solar). ## Here's WATTS Cookin' Cucumber, Tomato and Onion Salad

### Ingredients:

1/4 c. extra-virgin olive oil  
2 tbsp. vinegar (red wine, white  
wine, or rice wine)  
2 tsp. kosher salt  
1/4 tsp. garlic powder

1/4 tsp. freshly ground black pepper  
4 c. cherry tomatoes (1½ lb.), halved  
1 cucumber, quartered lengthwise  
and sliced  
1/2 medium onion, thinly sliced



1/2 cup roughly chopped fresh herbs  
(such as basil, cilantro, dill, mint,  
and/or parsley)

### Instructions:

In a large bowl, whisk oil, vinegar, salt, garlic powder, and black pepper. Add tomatoes, cucumber, onion and herbs and toss well to combine. Let sit at room temperature at least 15 minutes or refrigerate up to 12 hours. Before serving, sprinkle herbs over salad.
